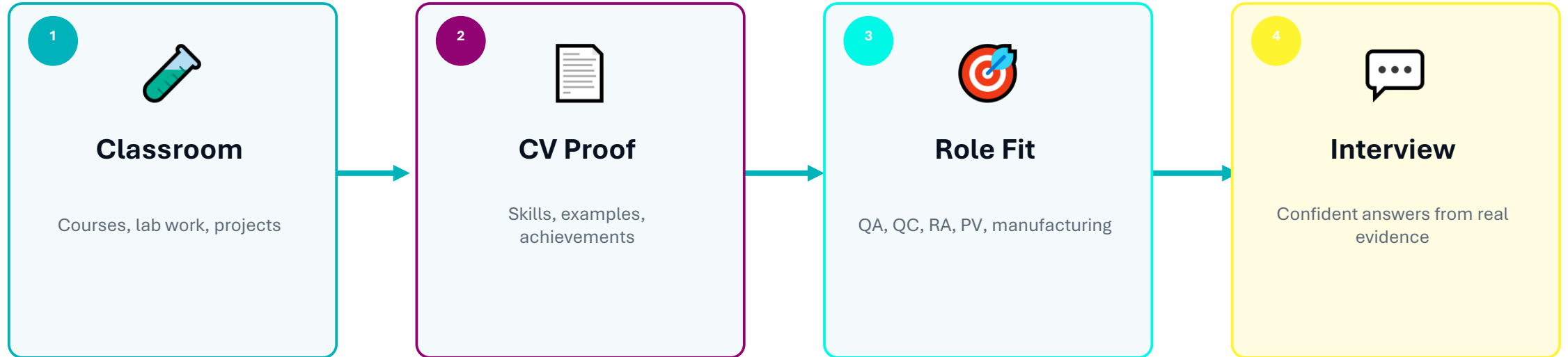

Why a pharma student CV must be role-focused

Recruiters do not only read education. They scan proof, keywords, and fit.



Goal: turn academic experience into job-ready evidence.

Build your pharma CV with six essential sections

Keep the structure simple. Make each section prove readiness for regulated pharma work.

YOUR NAME Pharmacy Student / Graduate

● Profile summary

● Education

● Technical skills

● Projects / thesis

● Internship experience

● Certificates

Profile summary

State your role target and strongest pharma strength.

Education

Add degree, university, graduation year, and relevant modules.

Skills

Separate technical skills from soft skills and tools.

Experience

Use tasks, outcomes, and quality-focused verbs.

Certificates

Include GMP, PV, QA/QC, RA, or lab training.

Skills to Add to a Pharma Student CV

1 Technical Skills



- GMP awareness
- Laboratory techniques
- Safe handling
- Documentation and data accuracy
- MS Office and Excel
- Report writing

2 Soft Skills



- Communication
- Teamwork
- Problem-solving
- Attention to detail
- Time management

3 Career Knowledge

Show your career direction by mentioning basic knowledge of:



- QA
- QC
- Regulatory Affairs
- Pharmacovigilance
- Manufacturing



Build a CV that connects academic learning to real pharma work.

Tailor one CV for different pharma roles

Use the same experience, but change the keywords and evidence for each target role.

QA

Keywords

SOPs, deviations, CAPA

Proof line

Reviewed records and followed GMP documentation

QC

Keywords

HPLC, assays, lab safety

Proof line

Analyzed samples and recorded results accurately

RA

Keywords

submissions, labeling, compliance

Proof line

Compared documents with regulatory requirements

PV

Keywords

ADR, case processing, safety

Proof line

Detected adverse event information in reports

Manufacturing

Keywords

batch records, equipment, cleaning

Proof line

Supported controlled production steps

Do not send a generic CV. Match the role language.

Convert student tasks into pharma CV bullets

Strong CV bullets show action, context, and quality value.



Before: too general

- Worked in the laboratory.
- Helped with documentation.
- Completed a university project.
- Learned about GMP.



After: pharma-focused

- Prepared lab samples and recorded results using controlled worksheets.
- Supported documentation review and corrected entries using ALCOA+ thinking.
- Completed a formulation project with stability, method, and report elements.
- Applied basic GMP principles to hygiene, traceability, and batch records.

Formula: Action verb + pharma task + quality result

Pharma internship CV checklist

Use this page before applying to internships, trainee roles, and entry-level jobs.

Must-have content

- ✓ One-page student CV with clear sections
- ✓ Short profile summary with target role
- ✓ Education, graduation year, and relevant modules
- ✓ Lab skills, GMP awareness, and documentation skills
- ✓ Projects, thesis, training, or internship tasks
- ✓ Certificates and pharma keywords

Quality control before sending

- | | |
|--------------------|--|
| Accuracy | No false claims or exaggerated skills. |
| Relevance | Every section supports the target role. |
| Readability | Simple layout, consistent spacing, no long paragraphs. |
| Proof | At least three examples of work, learning, or results. |

Your 10-minute CV audit

Before you apply, check the CV like a pharma document.

Clear

Can the recruiter see your target role in 10 seconds?

Accurate

Are dates, names, and certificates correct?

Relevant

Do your skills match the job description?

Readable

Is the CV clean, short, and consistent?

Evidence-based

Do you show tasks, tools, and outcomes?

Actionable

Does it support interview questions?

Next step: prepare one master CV and one role-specific version.
